CALL TO ORDER

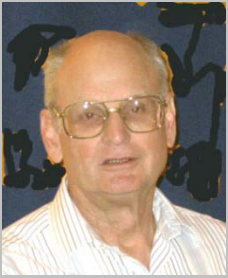
PREZ RALPH called the meeting to order at 12:19 PM.

THE PROGRAM

GINNY LEAR introduced today's speaker, Mary Greenwood, Chief of the Public Defender's Office in Santa



Clara County. The office was established in 1965 in response to the new Constitutional amendment guaranteeing all citizens the right of legal representation when they were called to appear in court. With so many citizens, the costs were excessive and a legal body was established to ensure their

representation. The same right holds true for people who were mentally deficient.

Ms. Greenwood was first appointed as an Associate Public Defender at the age of 24, and has seen the office grow from a few attorneys to the present number of over 200, plus some investigators. They handle about 200,000 cases a year, some routine, like drug enforcement actions, and some extended.

It was a very interesting topic, which led to many questions for Ms. Greenwood.
