"AMERICAN RESTING PLACE"

MIKE McMAHON introduced today's speaker, Marilyn Yalom. Professor Yalom has had a storied career as a writer and researcher. Her recent book co-produced with her photographer son is entitled "American Resting Place. 400 Years of History Through Our Cemeteries and Burial Grounds." Her many books have been translated into 20 languages.

Prof. Yalom and her son spent three years visiting and



photographing 250 early cemeteries and burial grounds throughout the United States. During her illustrated presentation she noted that head stones evolved from Death's heads to Angels and that cemeteries moved over time from the city to the countryside. Her slides ranged from Indian burial mounds to a Puritan Cemetery in the center of today's Boston to an early Spanish

cemetery in San Juan Batista. In the process, she shared various ethnic and cultural adaptations to honoring the dead, including the way slaves and servants were recognized (or not) by their owners. It was a fascinating view of history via a most unconventional approach. Thanks again to Mike and the Program Committee for “digging up” yet another great program. (Sorry about that, folks!)
